This morning I was watching the news when it caught my attention that some elementary school teachers from Cheran and Paracho were hit by a truck when they were in a protest near Uruapan. I immediately called home and found that my brother Agustín and my sisters were fine (they are teachers, but they were not at the site of the accident), but that Raul was there and his name was among the people who were hurt. I just got a message from David telling me that Raul certainly is at the hospital with some broken ribs but they hope he is going to recover. Please, pray for Raul and his family. Thank you so much.
