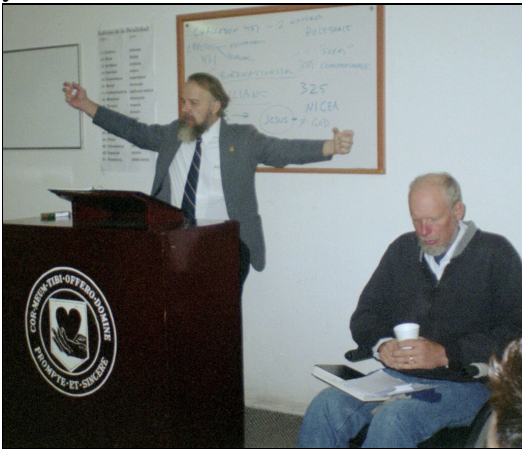

Reformation Conference

Once again Bill was the main speaker at the Reformation Day Conference at the *Seminario Teológico Juan Calvino* in Mexico City, and this year's topic was the Early Church Fathers. Rev. Greg Poorman, Presbyterian pastor from Painesville Ohio, accompanied Bill on the trip this year.

Just as the Reformers of the actual Reformation period labored to reform, re-claim, and re-store the church from the long accumulation of Roman Catholic practical abuses and doctrinal errors, so also the early Fathers were laboring to rescue and re-claim the church from so much of the encroachment of pagan Greek philosophy, speculation, error and heresy. So our study of the Fathers was a refreshing review of the foundations of the church.

While they were in Mexico City, Greg and Bill also preached in some of the Presbyterian churches in town. Each of the seminary professors is also a pastor in one of these churches. Professor Ramirez took Greg to preach in one, while Professor Custodio took Bill to preach in another.
